ATMC Gives Back \$2 Million in Capital Credit Refunds

ATMC Board of Directors President Lyle Ray King recently announced that the cooperative has issued \$2,000,000 in Capital Credit Refunds to current and former cooperative members who had telephone and/or cable TV service in 1996 and 1997.

As a membership cooperative, ATMC refunds to its members portions of revenues not used for expenses in a given year. These refunds are called Capital Credits. In July, ATMC's Board of Directors approved refunds totaling \$2,000,000 to be returned to members who had services during the 1996-1997 time frame.

"The patronage of our members has allowed ATMC to grow into the successful company that it is today," commented King. "When we have a successful year, we are able to return a portion of past profits to our members, and that is something that we are very happy to do." ATMC has issued over \$32 million in Capital Credit refunds in the last 25 years. Anyone who had telephone or cable service in 1996 or 1997 and has not received a Capital Credit refund by October 1st should call 755-1609. ●

When Learning Is a SNAP

West Brunswick High School (WBHS) Automotive Mechanics Instructor Robert Watkins always knew his students were eager to learn, but an ATMC Smart Connections Grant helped him shift their learning into overdrive by bringing the Snap Automotive Electrical Training system into his classroom.

Using the Snap Electronic Circuit Kits, students are able to build and test more than 700 different electrical circuits with reusable components to gain a better understanding of basic computer systems and scan tool diagnostics. "My students have completed dozens of projects with the Snap kits, including sound, temperature, and light-activated circuits," said Watkins. "Their favorite project so far has been a fan/propeller that launches from the motor when the power is removed."

Student Amanda Prince said the project has sparked a new interest in science for her. "The Electrical Kits were really fun, and I actually enjoyed learning," said Prince.

"Being able to figure out the different types of electrical circuits to either make a light come on or to make sound is cool. I never really cared about electricity in science class, but using the electrical kits has helped me understand how things work."

Watkins said the hands-on experience has been invaluable. He added, "Students have gained a greater understanding of electrical circuit operation. The majority of my students prefer hands-on learning, and the *Let's Build It* grant has enabled me to purchase the tools and equipment that provide these learning opportunities." He continued, "It's rewarding for me as an educator to see the entire class engaged and to know that I helped to make that possible."
